

FROST PRECAUTIONS

Please complete and return this form together with your payment before 31st October to have the following work carried out:

- 1 Switch off stop tap under caravan.
- 2 Isolate caravan from mains water supply (Disconnect).
- 3 Open all conspicuous drain cocks.
- 4 Open all taps.
- 5 Remove water heater drain screw/plug.
- 6 Remove and isolate flow switch (combi only).
- 7 Remove shower head and blow through.
- 8 Check non return valves if fitted to shower/bath.
- 9 Remove all water from toilet cisterns.
- 10 Anti-freeze W.C. pans.
- 11 Anti-freeze all water traps – shower/bath/sinks.
- 12 Re-connect on request.

Modern central heating boilers are complicated and take longer to drain down and reinstate, therefore we have to charge more for caravans with gas central heating. Your Licence Application form shows which fee you should pay.

CENTRAL HEATING FROST PRECAUTIONS = £88.20 inc VAT

Incomplete draining down leads to severe damage to shower units and boilers. Insurers want proof of drainage before paying out for any repair. The insurance does not cover the closed period of the Caravan Park for frost damage. For your safety it is also important that you have your Boiler serviced annually as you would at home. Every 3 years ask your gas engineer for a Certificate showing the correct amount of antifreeze is in place. We need a copy of the annual service and the antifreeze certificate when issued. We can recommend a local gas engineer.

Water will usually be turned back on for the 1st April unless you contact us beforehand to ask for this work to be done at a different time. The Insurance cover starts on March 15 for frost damage.
